



Liam Mucklow – CPGA Head Golf Professional

Liam joined the Canadian PGA in 2001 and graduated from the University of Alberta in 2002 with a Bachelor's of Physical Education. In his first year at Taboo Resort and Spa, Liam will be focusing his efforts on growing the Golf Academy.

Liam's teaching focuses on proper application of fundamentals to facilitate a change in ball flight. The focus of every lesson is to answer the "Why?"; only when a golfer has complete understanding of the root cause of their swing fault can they apply the proper fix and achieve permanent improvement.

Liam's teaching methodology is a compilation of experience garnered working under world class golf instructors such as Bruce McCarrol, Gary McCord, as well as Michael Bennett and Andy Plummer. Before setting out to make any swing changes Liam will use his biomechanical background to determine whether the swing fault is a function of **Facility** or **Ability**. Issues in Facility are faults in which the student has the coordination to perform a particular portion of the stroke pattern, but is not able to reproduce said pattern without artificial assistance. Issues in Ability relate to swing faults brought about a physical restriction due to past injury, or a lack of stability or mobility when viewed in a golf specific model. Liam has works with players of all level to help them achieve their golfing goals. In 2006 he was a Future Links Coordinator for Northern Alberta after returning from a 3 year stint in Korea. While in Asia Liam competed professional on various tours across the continent, as well as worked with Korean PGA and LPGA professionals to help them gain power and speed.

After only a few minutes of working with Liam his enthusiasm for the game and teaching it a readily apparent. If you are looking to make quantifiable improvement this summer and enjoy doing it then The Academy at Taboo is the place for you.

In addition to working with players of all levels, from beginner to touring professional, he has amassed a very impressive playing resume. Last year he finished top 25 in the Ontario PGA Order of Merit after competing in only 2 events, most notably T-4 at the Ontario PGA Championship. Since turning professional Liam has competed professionally in 6 countries around the world and is the winner of 5 professional tournaments.
